STATEMENT FROM WATTERSON.

He Charges the Railroad With the Responsibility for Kentucky's Trouble.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Feb. 5.—Mr. Henry Watterson today gave out the following statement:

"The head and front of our present troubles in Kentucky, at once the source and the resource of the revolutionary proceeding by which republican government has been struck down and a military dictatorship set up in its place, is the Louisville & Nashville Railroad company.

On the recent state campaign it supplied material resources in such abundance as to draw out all the dangerous elements of society and to put into activity all the forces of political adventure. The two leading parties to the contest were as nothing by comparison in which its gigantic machinery for corrupting the elections.

The hordes of desperate mountain men who were precipitated upon the state capital could never have got there except through its agency. It is at this moment the backbone of the movement to transfer the state capital from the city of Frankfort, its lawful abode, to the little village of London in Laurel county, situated upon one of its branches, in the heart of the venetia region whose turbulence has for years disgraced the state. It is believed that the withdrawal of its support from the defacto government would stop these dangerous and lawless proceedings.

of the peace officers has been put at defiance, whilst martial law has taken the place of the civil law, and on these lines an armed conflict is invited.

"This is the exact situation in Kentucky. I give it in answer to numerous telegrams and letters from all parts of the country asking it. I have no party interest to serve. I am not now and have not been for years in executive fellowship with the leaders of my own party; and my sole purpose is to represent to the sober, sense and good feeling of all parties that the condition of affairs in Kentucky is not that of force against force, justifying a certain neutrality in public opinion but that of a military usurpation unwarranted by law against what the law writers call the peace and dignity of the commonwealth."

THE NATION DISGRACED.

United States as Lawless a Country as France, According to a Prominent Divine.

NEW YORK, Feb. 5.—With the single exception of France, the United States is today the most disgraced of civilized nations," said Dr. Wm. S. Rainsford, rector of St. George's Protestant Episcopal church, in his sermon with reference to the murder of Goebel in Kentucky.

"We may say," he continued, "that the assassination of President Lincoln was a result of the chaos of civil war but we can offer no excuse for the murder of President Goebel; nor can we render explanation or apology for the ruthless shooting down of a senator in the capital of Kentucky."

"It is a nervous age," said Dr. Rainsford, and particularly so with the people of America. Dangerous indeed is the day when people from ocean to ocean can be fired at a moment's notice to frenzy, swayed to a point of hyper-hysteria. And yet that is the situation in the United States today. Our millions of people are the most easily fired to impulsive action by a sentiment of all the nations.

"What are we to do with such criminals as those who have disgraced the nation with the recent tragedy in Kentucky? Hang them? Yes, hang the guilty assassin, for the more of such brutes are hanged the freer will society be.

"But that is no remedy for the evil that is now the curse of Kentucky and the blight of the nation. Recent happenings at Frankfort are but the climax of what has been going on in that state for years. Disregard for law has been an unrecurrent of sin growing slowly day by day. The same condition prevails throughout the land—right here in New York as much as any where.

"It is due to the greed of men to get more than their share by disregarding the law and the cure rests not in hanging the criminal, but in going at the very root of the evil and infusing into the minds of the people of Kentucky, the lesson of Christ's obedience to law.

Withdraws from the Republican League Contest.

BANKER CHURCH IS THE MAN

The LaGrande Capitalist Will Direct the Destinies of the Republican League Next Year.

PORTLAND, Feb. 5.—The Republican League of Oregon will meet in Armory hall tomorrow, and it is expected that between seven and eight hundred delegates will be present, representing every county in the state.

C. W. Fulton, of Astoria; Judge Jas. Fee, of Pendleton, and E. V. Carter, of Ashland, who have been making a most active canvass for the presidency of the league, withdrew this afternoon, and it was practically settled tonight that J. M. Church, the banker of LaGrande, will be chosen.

L. A. Macrum, of Portland, is slated for vice-president.

At the caucus tonight Theodore Cameron, of Jackson, was selected as the member of the executive committee at large. W. H. Moore, of Morrow, was selected as a member of the executive committee from the Second congressional district, and J. W. Meldrum, of Clackamas, a member of the executive committee from the First district.

The league will endorse McKinley's administration, expansion, the gold standard and will probably declare for the permanent retention of the Philippines by the United States.

OREGON EDITORS MEET.

PORTLAND, Feb. 5.—At a biennial meeting of the Oregon Republican Editorial Association held here today, the following officers were elected for the ensuing two years: President, D. M. C. Gault, of Hillsboro; secretary, Wm. J. Clarke, of Gervais; treasurer, S. S. Train, of Albany. Executive committee: J. B. Eddy, of Forest Grove; J. J. Whitney, of Albany; C. L. Ireland, of Moro.

The members of the association will demand the legal patronage of their respective counties while there is a republican administration in power.

KOBE'S BIG CAMPAIGN.

MANILA, Feb. 5.—Brigadier-General Kobbe's expedition in the islands of Luzon, Leyte and Samar has occupied permanently and garrisoned nine towns with the Forty-third and Forty-seventh regiments. This has placed on the market 150,000 bales of hemp.

Thousands of insurgents, armed with rifles, and over 5,000 armed with wooden swords and bows and arrows, were encountered during the trip. The troops killed 75 natives, eleven of whom had rifles. The others were villagers, armed with wooden swords. The American loss was one man killed and nine wounded.
