JAPANESE AFFAIRS.

Anti-Christian Sentiment—Mining Boom in Corea of a Political Nature—Japanese Enterprise in Formosa.

YOKOHAMA, May 25, via Victoria, B. C., June 6.—In the lull which has followed the rejoicings over the imperial wedding, little of interest has transpired.

How far the present mining boom in Corea is of a merely political nature it is difficult to say. There has been a remarkable number of demands upon the government of that country for mining concessions and privileges.

Japan's administration of Fomosan affairs is beginning to be greatly to its credit, as a colonial power, the work of the government indicating that the island is assured a prosperous future.

Secretary Long to Test the Battleships Indiana and Massachusetts For Speed in Getting Into Active Service.

WASHINGTON, June 6.—Secretary Long has issued an order for an experiment of the utmost importance to the navy.

The purpose is to see how much time would be occupied in putting into condition for active naval service a part of the United States fleet to meet an emergency.

The vessels selected for the experiment are the battleships Indiana and Massachusetts, now laid up in ordinary at League Island, with a skeleton organization of officers and men aboard.

Orders have been telegraphed Admiral Casey, the commander of the League Island Yard, and the two captains above named, to put the ships in to condition for immediate service to last at least 30 days.

The hardest question to deal with in the present straits of the navy is that of personnel. Officers were wired at once and it was necessary to rob some of the bureaus of the navy department of much needed assistance.

Millionaires Seek to Be Relieved From Taxation Upon Their New York Property.

NEW YORK, June 6.—Bradley Martin and William Waldorf Astor, formerly two of New York City's wealthiest residents are seeking to be relieved of taxes placed upon their personal property here.

Mr. Astor has not only given up his residence here, but also has renounced his citizenship and is now a citizen of England.

William Waldorf Astor's certiorari proceedings to review the action of the commissioners in assessing his personal property in this city for 1899, for the purpose of taxation at \$2,000,000 has been set for hearing next Tuesday.
