Mr. Booth is credited with saying that there is no profit in canning fish when the packers are compelled to pay six cents a pound for them. For that reason his firm proposes to erect a cold storage plant. Mr. Booth states, however, that the cannery will continue to be operated as heretofore. There is an obvious inconsistency in the statements. If the cannery business is no longer profitable it is hardly to be expected that such successful business men as the members of his company will sink money in its operation, but on the contrary they would certainly abandon it entirely for the cold storage industry from which he expects so much. The fact is that the demand for canned salmon is continually on the increase, especially so since the government has introduced it into new markets by supplying it to our soldiers in China and the Philippines. It is not too much to expect that the demand from the far East will in the near future exceed the supply. This part of the world will be the source of that supply because nearest the market. Nor can the fish handled by the cold storage men drive out of any market the superior and more conveniently handled canned product. The demand for canned salmon will never cease and the market price will continue to be regulated by the cost. Those who want the best will continue to use the Columbia river brands. The erection of cold storage plants means the establishment here of new interests and by no means the displacement of the old. There is nothing in the situation to create a feeling of pessimism. On the contrary it indicates higher prices and greater profits to all concerned. With the thoroughgoing policy for the conservation of the industry being inaugurated by our fish warden there is every indication that in the future as in years past there will be enough fish for all the canneries and cold storage plants combined.
