TARIFF PROBLEM IN THE ISL-ANDS.

The supreme court has not yet decidof special tariff legislation for Porto Rico and the Philippines. The practical before the court is whether or island possessions which the federal government acquired under the provisions of the treaty of Paris are part of the United States and subject to the constitution and general The constitution vests in congress the power "to lay and collect taxes, duties, imports and excises, to pay the debts and provide for the common defense and general welfare of the Unit. ed States:" but declares that "all dues, imposts, and excises shall be uniform throughout the United States."

If the supreme court should decide that this provision of the constitution applies to Porto Rico and the Philippines, there would be a decided change of sentiment as to the desirability of their acquisition. In fact, some almost Insurmountable difficulties would be presented. President Schurman, in an article in Collier's Weekly, says that it does not seem feasible in any way to assimilate the tariff of the Philippines to that of the United States.
