

LEO IS IN GOOD HEALTH

RETURN OF CARDINAL GIBBONS FROM ROME.

Had Three Audiences With the Pope—Church Affairs in the Philippines.

BALTIMORE, Aug. 26.—Cardinal Gibbons reached home this afternoon after a tour of Europe. He was greeted by a crowd of 10,000 people.

The cardinal reviewed the procession and talked extensively after the parade on conditions abroad. He was much interested in the status of the steel strike and said he hoped it would be settled soon.

LEO IN GOOD HEALTH.

Has the Vigor of a Man of Sixty-Five.

NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—"I can convey to the people of the United States," said Cardinal Gibbons in an interview last night, "the welcome news that Pope Leo is enjoying excellent health. I received from him the assurance that no change will be made by the church in the administration of religious affairs in the Philippines, Cuba or Porto Rico."

"While in London, I met Archbishop Chappelle of New Orleans, the Pope's Apostolic delegate to the Philippines following the trouble with the friars. The Spanish Bishop of Manila will be retained. Many improvements were made during the visit of the Archbishop to Manila and the pope is satisfied with the administration of affairs there."

"During my visit in London I was the guest of Cardinal Vaughan. He will return the visit to me within a short time. In Ireland I was entertained by Cardinal Lough, the oldest cardinal in the Catholic church. At Wexford I gave an address on the welfare of Ireland. I advised Irishmen to remain in their own country instead of coming to this country. I told them that it required superior energy to succeed here and if they had that energy they would be wise to stay at home and use it for the betterment of their own country."

"My three audiences with the pope, the last on June 26, were the most gratifying features of my sojourn abroad. He is a wonderful man and possesses wonderful vitality. It is my intention to see that as many Catholic teachers as possible are sent to Cuba and Porto Rico to found schools. Soon after my return home I will call a conference of Archbishops at Baltimore."

"Reports that I suffered from illness soon after landing in Naples were erroneous. They tell me every one has suffered here from the heat. I have suffered from the cold. Among my first duties on returning to Baltimore will be the filling of the Bishopric of Florida, made vacant by the death of Bishop Moore."

REPUBLICANS MUST CHOOSE.

French Journal Says United States Will Seize Columbia and Venezuela as We Did Cuba.

PARIS, Aug. 26.—Discussing South America, the Journal des Debats says: "France has no reason to interfere in these pitiable quarrels between sister republics, but merely to defend the private interests of her citizens especially in Panama."

"The neutrality which we shall maintain if war breaks out does not, however, exclude a preference for Venezuela treated the French claims in such a manner that diplomatic relations were broken off in 1894. We have not the same reason for complicity against Colombia."

"The present state of things cannot continue. The United States is too near and its natural development too great. Colombia and Venezuela must choose between the lot of Canada which remains a free neighbor of the United States because it is orderly and that of Cuba which was taken away from Spain because chronic anarchy reigned there."

A mob formed and the houses of a number of negroes were entered, doors being broken in amid great confusion and much noise. Threats were made that all negroes should be driven from the place. The police were called out and the rioters were dispersed. A number of people on both sides were injured but no fatalities are reported.

NOTED FIENIAN DYING.

Was Charged With Complicity With the Three "Manchester Martyrs."

NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Patrick Malady, who many years ago was convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment in England for complicity in the Fenian plot for which the three Irishmen known as "The Manchester Martyrs" were executed is dying in St. Michael's hospital, Newark, N. J.

Malady was pardoned after serving 10 years of his sentence and came to this country, going out west. He returned to Newark some months ago in bad health. Malady insists that he is innocent of the offense for which he was convicted.

WOMAN'S TRYING VIGIL.

Captain's Wife Spends Night in Small Boat Expecting Schooner to Sink.

NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Mrs. Silas Dodd, wife of the captain of the schooner Eliza Scribner from Boston for Savannah yesterday reported beached off Fire Island had a thrilling experience before she was rescued by life savers.

"When the vessel struck a sunken wreck and began to let in water, Captain Dodd ordered the small boats over the side and provisioned. He told his wife to get into the boat and at his command cut the tow line running to the schooner. He gave her a sheath knife. All night the woman sat in the small boat. In the darkness she could barely make out the hull of the schooner. Every minute she expected to hear her husband cry out to cut the line. When the life savers reached her she was in a semi-conscious condition."

AFTER THE DETECTIVES.

Commission Will Investigate the Workings of the Detective Bureau.

CHICAGO, Aug. 26.—The civil service commission will begin its investigation of the detective bureau this afternoon, holding its sessions in the city council chambers. The specific charge to be inquired into will be that of Detective J. J. and Sergeant Tracy and Cramer collected from the state of Illinois \$5 as expenses for bringing a prisoner named Larkin back from Cleveland.

The matter really goes further than this, however, and it is the purpose of Acting Mayor Walker and Superintendent of Police O'Neil to uncover the entire workings of the detective bureau.

THE RESULTS KNOWN

ABSOLUTE PROOF THAT MOSQUITOS CARRY DISEASE.

Precautions Against Yellow Fever Will Greatly Reduce Death Rate in Havana.

NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Dr. A. H. Doty, discussing the death in Havana of Miss Clara Maud, reported his recently expressed opinion that the results achieved fully warranted the experiments that are being carried on in Cuba.

"We must not look simply at the deaths of the three persons in Havana," said Dr. Doty, "but we must consider also the measurable number of lives that will be saved by this absolute proof that mosquitoes carry yellow fever. This was the only way to find it out. We now know beyond question that people must protect themselves by netting, especially at night, from mosquitoes in districts infected with yellow fever, and that they must get rid of drainage and other means of the unsanitary conditions that favor the propagation of mosquitoes."

"That such precautions against infection by mosquitoes produce the results intended is shown by the fact that this year for the first time in the medical history of Cuba there has been no natural case of yellow fever in Havana and only six or seven in the suburbs. Within six years there have been as many as 500 cases in Havana at one time with a consequent mortality of from fifteen to thirty-five percent and even three or four years ago there were 200 cases at a time.

"Since the sanitary conditions have been made so very much better, however, and netting has been used so much more, this great advance in the health of the city has come. These precautions against the fever were stimulated of course by the belief that the mosquitoes carried the disease, but this belief is now changed to certain knowledge."

KING CARNIVAL NOW REIGNS

Street Fair and Carnival Open and the Week of Merry Making Has Started in.

For the Street Fair is opened and the midway is here. The gay and naughty dancers from depraved Egypt are gyrating to the accompaniment of the queer musical instruments of the country, and the Algerians go through their national dances to the strains of an upright piano and the melody of "See Never Saw the Streets of Calcutta." There is a suggestion of other nations from one end

of the midway to the other. In the German village are several well-fed Tyrolean peasants; in the Mexican enclosures are the dark haired, black-eyed senoritas of our sister republic, and in another tent are star-eyed sons of Japan who exhibit their acrobatic prowess.

It is no small matter to give a show as large as the one plotted by George Jabour in the brief space of time between the closing of the Tacoma fair and the opening of the Astoria carnival. At midnight Saturday the last performance was given in the Sound city. Yesterday afternoon the first performance was given here. If there was an air of unrestrained confidence what had been accomplished in the brief space of time. Today the shows will all be going without a hitch; the remainder of the electric lights will be installed and the management will be ready for the crowds.

Already a large number of strangers are in the city. The street parade yesterday was viewed by several thousand people, who lined the streets along

which the procession moved. Fire Chief Stockton, assisted by his aides, J. M. Elsworth and Sheriff Lavinia, were in charge of the parade. Mayor Bergman, the members of the city council and police department preceded that part of the parade given over to Mr. Jabour's people. The latter section was headed by Colonel Daniel Boone, lineal descendant of the famous Kentucky pioneer, and a retinue of his descendants. Following were Turks, Egyptians, Algerians, Tyrolians and representatives of other nations. A large camel with gorgeous variegated trappings carried the principal ladies of the Egyptian

contingent. Several cages containing wild animals including several magnificent specimens of African lions were in the procession.

There are two star features of the bill. One is advertised and quite deservedly is a headliner—the act of the Aerial Austins. The three sisters who comprise the team, are exceptionally clever performers on the trapeze and acrobatics, and their flights through space are thrilling and full of momentary excitement. The other star, the unexpected one, is the little buck-and-wing dancer in the German village, and she is the hit of the performance. She is only five, but she has figured it out

that she is entitled to the center of the stage, and if she doesn't occupy it conspicuously, in a literal sense, she surely, figuratively, is a disgrace to the show without any compensation. Last night, while waiting to do her turn, she amused herself by investigating the piano and making the heavy keys move by manipulations on the inside. The little cut can dance most marvelously well considering her age and apparently she enjoys her work. When she grows older her name will be in large type and a new society will have "arrived." As it is her baby, confidence and self-possession creates interest in whatever she does.
