SCRANTON, Pa., Dec. 5 .- Two hundred and eighty-five delegates, repre senting more than million and a half workmen responded to roll call at the opening session of the twenty-first annual convention of the American Federation of Labor, which was called to order by President Samuel Gompers. this morning.

The convention, is said to be the largest congress of workmen ever held in this country. Organization, settlement of questions involving contested seats, and reading of the annual report of the president, secretary and treasurer took up the entire session of the convention. During the day there was one surprise sprung on the delegates and one important decision made. The surprise came in the form United Mineworkers delegates because tax. The motion was overruled. The dispute was adjusted by scating the central labor union representative and instructing the executive board of the American Federation of Labor to form a strong central union for colored men.
