The annual meeting of the Columbia River Packers Association occurs tomorrow afternoon, when officers will be elected for the coming year. A. B. Hammond, president of the association, is expected to arrive in the city tomorrow morning to attend the meeting.

The opening of the Commercial Club's new bowling alleys, which was scheduled for Monday evening, has been postponed until Wednesday evening. The officers of the club have made extensive preparations for the entertainment of the members of the club and their wives on that occasion.

Contractors Mattson and Haggblom arrived in the city yesterday with a grain cargo for the United Kingdom. The treasury department has not yet made a ruling in the case of the Latimer, which arrived here without the requisite bill of health. The vessel ex-

pected a little hard luck on her last trip and has been held up pending settlement of the matter. When she sailed from Rio de Janeiro Captain Johnson had orders to proceed to Tahiti, Chile, where it was supposed a cargo awaited the ship. Accordingly, as vessels clearing between foreign ports are not required to secure health papers, the Latimer neglected to provide her crew with a bill from the American consul at Rio. Arriving at Tahiti Captain Johnson received orders to proceed to Astoria. In order to have complied with the United States regulations he would have been compelled to return to Rio, there secure a bill of health and then come to this port. Deputy Collector Parker was of the opinion that it would be unwise to impose a fine in the case of the Latimer and so recommended to the department. The recommendation was submitted three weeks ago and if the Latimer wishes to proceed to sea she will not be detained. The department's decision is awaited with interest, as it will establish a precedent. Other similar cases have come up at this port, and usually a fine of \$500 has been imposed, though the department seldom permitted the fine to stand.
