**CRITICISM WAS GENERAL**

How Minority Report on Philippine Tariff Was Received at Manila

MANILA, Jan. 28.—The criticism of the senate minority report on the Philippine tariff bill has been general, both public and private here, though many persons admit that the statements made in the report are correct.

General Wharton's vigorous criticisms referred entirely to Professor Schurman's speech at Boston, though he holds the professor in high personal esteem. The statement that a person who made such remarks here as those credited to Professor Schurman's Boston speech would be sent to jail, referred merely to the recent sedition law.

**HIS ACT EXCUSABLE**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—Secretary Root today acted on the case of Lieutenant Preston Brown, Second Infantry, who was sentenced by court-martial to be dismissed from the service. Lieutenant Brown shot a native Filipino because he allowed an American soldier to drown when he might easily have saved him.

Secretary Root takes the ground that Brown's action, while not justifiable, was excusable under all circumstances and he therefore recommends that the sentence of dismissal be commuted.

**BINDER TWINE SEIZED**

BOSTON, Jan. 28.—Two carloads of binder twine have been seized by treasury agents at Newburyport on the ground that the twine was the product of prison labor in a Canadian penitentiary. Under the government laws, shipments of such product into the United States is prohibited. The amount seized was 20,000 pounds worth \$5000.

**MINE OF PURE SILVER**

NEHAULT, Mont., Jan. 28.—Two prospectors, Dave Develyn and W. H. Harmon, who are leasing the Ofrien mine, have struck what is believed to be a mine of pure silver. They have secured thirteen tons of the ore which is almost malleable. An average assay is 18,000 ounces, which gives a value to the ton of nearly \$800 in the white metal.

**MARIETTA AT COLON**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—The navy department today was advised of the arrival of the gunboat Marietta at Colon from Culebra Island, in conformity with orders issued by the department owing to threatened renewal of hostilities on the Isthmus.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—The senate today confirmed the following nominations: David H. Jarvis, collector of customs, district of Alaska; R. V. Custer, United States attorney, Idaho.
