WASHINGTON, March 12.-The sente committee decided to support Hepourn's isthmian canal bill.

Action of the committee was taken afternoon and came after a brief report by Senator Morgan, chairman of the committee detailing the result of the conference with Secretary Hay as to the status of diplomatic negotiations with Central American republics concerning the canal. He stated that the ecretary told him that there is no nerotiation pending between the Unled States and Colombia concerning Panaroute and that on the other hand the republics of this country and those of Nicaragua and Costa Rica had been in consultation and had agreed upon practically all points to be covered in the concession treaties, nothing really being left in that connection but to put the agreements in writing.
