TIMBER CRUISERS.

Conducting Bunco Game on Olympia Reserve.

PORT TOWNSEND, Wash., March 13.—There is a demand for timber lands in a portion of the Olympia reserve recently thrown open by the government, and timber cruisers are conducting a bunco game.

Cruisers show intended victims a piece of land thickly timbered, but give them a description of vacant land on which there is no timber. After paying a cruiser from \$50 to \$200, they proceed to the land office and file on the land, from description given them. Many have been made victims.

LIBERAL NEW YORKERS.

Want to Invest Heavily in St. Louis Fair.

NEW YORK, March 13.—At a meeting of the New York Board of Trade and Transportation it was decided to recommend to the legislature that an appropriation of not less than \$800,000 be made for representation of the state of New York at the St. Louis exposition, and that a commission be appointed to protect the state's interests there.

A resolution was unanimously adopted, congratulating the city and people of St. Louis on their enterprise and giving the board's endorsement to the success of the undertaking.

GENERAL YOUNG CHOSEN.

WASHINGTON, March 13.—Major-General S. M. E. Young has been relieved from command of the department of California, and ordered to this city to accept the presidency of the army war college which is to be established at Washington barracks, providing that necessary funds are provided by congress.

STRIKE IN VIRGINIA UNCHANGED

NORFOLK, Va., March 13.—The strike situation is unchanged. Boys were throwing bricks through car windows tonight. Lady was struck on head and painfully injured.

REVOLUTIONISTS GAINING.

Now Hold All Interior Provinces Outside of Panama and Colon.

NEW YORK, March 13.—The revolutionists now hold all interior provinces of the isthmus outside of Panama and Colon, cables the correspondent of the Herald.

The Ecuadorian government, the dispatch says, has sent special orders to the local authorities in Guayaquil to make the visit of the United States cruiser Philadelphia as pleasant as possible. Formal protest has been made by the Colombian minister to Quito against the Ecuadorian expedition on the eastern frontier. The protest is based on the tripartite convention signed in Lima, Peru, in 1894.

HORSES FOR AFRICA.

Montana Cayuses for the Chas and Retreat.

SHERIDAN, Mont., March 13.—British Agent J. A. Conway, who is purchasing horses for the use of the English cavalry against the Boers in South Africa, purchased a large band of animals in this vicinity.

These horses will be shipped to Utah where they will be inspected by the British officers. Letters will be sent to South Africa. The British express great satisfaction with the hardy mountain cayuse from Montana. Over the roughest ground the animals appear almost indefatigable, hour after hour keeping up the swinging gait peculiar to the range horses.

POSTPONED.

NEW YORK, March 13.—The convoking of the Chilean congress has, according to a Herald dispatch from Valparaiso, been postponed until the end of this month.

STRAUSS URGED CLAIMS.

NEW YORK, March 13.—Oscar C. Strauss, ex-United States minister to Turkey, has received a letter from the American board of Commissioners for foreign missions, thanking him for the part he took in the payment of the indemnity claims against Turkey for losses incurred in 1895-96.

ADDITIONAL LOCAL.

The four-masted schooner Reporter, Captain Hazen, bound from Grays Harbor to San Francisco, drifted ashore yesterday morning on the beach south of the Cliff House close to the life-saving station. The officers and crew were landed, but the vessel is breaking up and will probably prove a total loss.

At a meeting of the executive committee of the Portland Board of Trade yesterday afternoon the announcement was made that the Port of Portland commissioners had arranged with New York contractors to go ahead with the new Portland dry-dock at once. The contract has been drawn up and forwarded to New York for signature and the contractors have guaranteed the successful operation of the dock upon its completion, and the dock is to be completed on or before January 1, 1902.

Union ship caulkers, joiners, riggers and ship carpenters to the number of 15 quit work on the French bark Asie in Portland Wednesday night because of the fact that non-union iron ship-builders were employed. They returned yesterday morning on regular time but after a few minutes' consultation laid down their tools and walked away. It was contrary to expectations, however, as it had been decided the previous night by the proper authorities that the men should continue work during negotiations in the matter. The matter will be decided by the Federated Trades Council. Until then the strike will doubtless hold on.

Twenty-one sawmills, representing a combined output of 500,000 feet of railroad ties daily, have formed a combination in Portland under the name of the "Columbia River Tie and Lumber Association." The purpose of the combine is to raise the price on their output. The tie manufacturers claim that the tie has been too low for some time for a reasonable profit and that action of some kind was necessary and that the present action seems to be the best. The meeting was brought about in Portland by correspondence the first of the present week and after holding a number of secret sessions they formed the combination yesterday. They have only received 23 and 25¢ for ties in the past and it is now the purpose to ask for 25 cents. The combine is composed of mills on Lewis river, Hood river, and at Vancouver and Troutdale. Outside of the statement that the combine has been formed and that the price of ties has been raised to 25¢, each of the members of the combine refuse to give any information.
