CALL FOR CONVENTION.

Notice is hereby given that there will be held in the City of Astoria at Fish-er's opera house on Friday, March 28, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m., a Republican county convention, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the various county offices, as follows: One state senator, two representatives, county judge, one commissioner, clerk, sheriff, treasurer, assessor, surveyor, school superintendent, coroner, justice of the peace, constable, road supervisor.

The apportionment of delegates is based on the vote cast for Malcolm A. Moody for congress, in 1900, allowing one delegate for each 20 votes cast in each precinct, one for each fraction over 20 votes and one delegate at large, entitling the city precinct to 22 delegates from the first ward, 16 delegates from the second ward, 10 delegates from the third ward.
