The editorial in yesterday's Astorian on the subject of pensioning life-savers in the service of the government upon becoming disabled in the service caused considerable comment. While the matter has not been discussed extensively in the public press, yet for years life-savers and their friends have been trying to get the matter favorably considered by congress. It was claimed yesterday by one in a position to know that the present conditions are more favorable than would be a pensioning system. He said that this applied especially in case of a serious injury received while in the service. Under present conditions life-savers who are disabled in the service are always entitled to one year's pay after the injury is received and if the case justifies it the government allows two years' pay. It is claimed that this sum is worth more to a disabled life-saver than would be a small pension for years. By receiving it in a bulk the disabled is permitted to enjoy it while he lives and it also amounts to enough to start him in a small business. With a good business man this would possibly be the best plan, but for the man who has not good habits, or is a failure in financing, it would doubtless be better to receive the money in smaller installments from month to month in the way of a regular pension and thus provide him against any financial ca-

The manufacturers of the country are now importing more than a million dollars worth of material for their workshops every day in the year, and are exporting more than a million dollars worth of their finished product each day. The imports of manufacturers' materials in the eight months ending with February, 1902, were, according to a statement just issued by the treasury bureau of statistics, \$77,202,774, and the exports of finished manufactures during the same period were \$27,907,430. Thus in 243 days of the fiscal year the manufacturers have imported 270 million dollars' worth of material and exported 257 million dollars' worth of their finished product, thus averaging more than \$1,000,000 of both imports and exports for every day of the fiscal year up to the beginning of the present month. The importation of manufacturers' materials has been greater in the eight months just ended than in the corresponding period of any preceding year.
