NEWSPAPER ERRORS.

Newspapers are often criticized for the errors they contain. Errors slip through in the very best regulated offices where every department has an expert in every line. The editorial writer looks after his department, the city editor his department, the telegraph editor his department, the managing editor then looks after it all except the proof reader, who holds the responsibility over all as to typographical errors, and yet errors occur; and in an office where one or two cover the whole field it is no wonder that errors sometimes occur. The editor is as quick to see these errors next morning as any reader of the paper and he "smarts" under it, but he can only try to do better next time. Custom will not cure errors. If it could there is no telling what kind of language we should have after a while. We constantly receive announcements and personals from the most prominent and those in the best position to become errorless, but if they could see their productions re-edited they would be startled, though after it is put in print it is not so noticeable. If the process of technical re-editing the average newspaper were gone through with, the paper would look more like a map of some foreign country than a newspaper. Manuscripts are frequently received in

newspaper offices and they are printed that way, which reads: A grand ball will "occur on" Wednesday, April —, or there was born unto Mary Smith, "wife of John Smith, a bouncing girl," or Miss Rebecca Jones was married "to Tom Smith" last Saturday, or Tom Brown is "stopping" at the leading hotel; but these are only a few out of the hundred errors that creep in. The words "occur" and "on" are most frequently abused. A fire may "occur" for fires are not ordinarily expected. Anything not expected occurs, but matters previously arranged and organized take place, such as falls, games, church services and all things fixed definitely, but they do not "occur." A game of basket ball need not necessarily "occur" "on" Wednesday, July 4, but it should simply take place Wednesday, July 4; then the child is not only born to Mrs. John Smith, but husband and wife are equally interested in their offspring and the child is born unto Mr. and Mrs. John Smith; Rebecca Jones is not necessarily married to Tom Smith any more than is Tom Smith married to her, hence Mr. Tom Smith "and" Miss Rebecca Jones were married, etc.; and Tom Smith may have stopped at the Occident Hotel when he arrived in the city, but after he "stopped" he must have "stayed" if he is still there. It would be difficult for one to continue stopping, but one may be staying. But these are only a few, and those who insist in using them should not complain if they find a comma upside down or a letter occasionally transposed in a word. There are other greater crimes.

The incident of Captain Cloke being changed from Fort Stevens, Oregon, to San Francisco, California, is an illustration that an officer's life is not always sunshine when he is not in battle. It is probably one of the sorriest trials of the captain's life and he would rather go into a dozen battles than make the sacrifice he must make. During his stay at the mouth of the Columbia he has made the closest of bosom friends everywhere, and when he leaves, according to the rule of a soldier's life, he may never meet many of them again. Bullets only effect the body, take away life, perhaps, but the cutting of the ties of friendship affects the heart, rends the soul.
