DEMOCRATIC HARMONY.

A Love Feast on the Occasion of Jefferson's Birthday.

NEW YORK, April 14.—Members of the Democratic Club tonight commemorated the birthday of Thomas Jefferson with a reception at the club house. It was looked upon among Democrats of the city and state as a harmony meeting. David B. Hill, who had not visited the club for a number of years, was the chief orator of the evening and in his speech he called upon Democrats to unite in harmony. Perry Belmont, whose differences with Bryan and Croker have kept him away from the club for three years, was also there.

HEAVILY INSURED.

President Roosevelt Carries Largest Policy on Record.

NEW YORK, April 14.—Since he became chief executive of the Nation, President Roosevelt has become one of the most heavily insured men in the United States.

The president has taken out a policy for \$50,000 in a New York Company, besides continuing policies for smaller amounts which he has taken out long before he was elected governor of New York. President Roosevelt's policies, it is said, exceed by \$15,000 or \$10,000 those held by President McKinley, was paid about \$60,000 on policies on her husband's life.

BOY COUNTERFEITER.

LOUISVILLE, April 14.—Philip Hans, a 14-year-old boy in his fresh-

man year at Manual Training High School, has been arrested by Secret Service Agent Donnell, on the charge of making counterfeit nickels and quarters. The boy's story is that he found the money, but the secret service agent declares that he has made use of the dies and mold employed in the metal working department of the school. The counterfeit is crude and the officers believe the boy is alone in his work.

DIED AT OVER 100.

Another One Who Performed Services for La Fayette Dies.

NEW YORK, April 14.—Mrs. Hannah Barlow is dead at her home in New Brunswick, N. J. She would have been 106 years old May 1. In her younger years Mrs. Barlow was a servant for Commodore Vanderbilt. When La Fayette passed through she helped cook the dinner for him and his staff.

BIG LAND PURCHASE.

OMAHA, April 14.—Fifty thousand acres of grazing land was purchased today by a party of sheep men of Western Wyoming. Buying of land, said one of the purchasers, is part of plan of sheep raisers to force cattle men out of the district over which there has been so much strife.
