**TIMID GREEKS.**

NEW YORK, April 22.—Of the 1000 immigrants who have just arrived in the storages of the liners Patria, Symrie, Zealand and Gasconne, there were 400 in the latter vessel who were not sure of the final destination until they saw the American flag over the forts at the Narrows. **AMERICAN ENTERPRISE**

A Party of Engineers Leave for Bremen to Construct a Railway.

NEW YORK, April 22.—A party of engineers who will construct this summer the first American built railway in Europe, has sailed for Bremen. The railway will be used to ship large quantities of iron from the Norwegian mines. The engineers in the party are former State Engineer Adams, his son, Arthur, C. A. Poole and Arthur O'Brien. On reaching Bremen they will meet Henschel Roberts, ex-deputy state engineer, who has charge of the dealings of the new road, and will accompany him to Mo, on the west coast of Norway, 300 miles north of Christiania, where the mouth of a rock-walled fjord will be made into a great harbor. From the docks there the new railway will run to the ore fields, 18 miles away. Three thousand laborers will be employed in the work. The Gillson ore mining syndicate of London, is the backer of the scheme. A director of the corporation is Thomas A. Edison. Most of the materials used will be sent from the United States and the rolling stock will be of American manufacture. It is expected the total cost will exceed \$1,000,000.

**LEVIED AN ASSESSMENT.**

VANCOUVER, Wash., April 22.—Receiver Eastham, of the First National Bank, which suspended a year ago, has received notice from the controller of currency stating an assessment of 60 per cent has been levied upon the stockholders. It is estimated that the amount raised by assessment will be sufficient with remaining assets of the bank to make up a deficit of 25 per cent still due depositors with interest and pay other creditors.
