### VIGILANCE COMMITTEE.

CHICAGO, April 25.—Aroused by the murder Wednesday of Peter Fafinski, 1000 citizens of the Sixteenth Ward, mostly Polish-Americans, have organized a vigilance committee whose object will be to drive the objectionable element from the ward. Lawlessness for years has characterized that part of the city and the committee will make a determined effort to purify the district.

Fafinski was shot by robbers, Julius Fafinski, son of the dead man who also was shot, is reported to be dying.

### SPRING WEATHER IN ALASKA.

PORT TOWNSEND, Wash., April 25.—The steamer City of Seattle arrived from the North today. Returning passengers report typical spring weather in all sections of Southeastern Alaska and snow and ice rapidly disappearing and predict an early opening of navigation on the Yukon. White Horse river is open and ice running out as far as Lake Lebarge and great activity is being displayed for a general rush down the river as soon as the river is free from ice. Preparatory work for the construction of the largest tunnel in the world has been completed at Juneau. The tunnel will be nearly eight thousand feet long and will tap a series of quarries at a depth of eight hundred feet in the Silver Boy basin back of Juneau.

### NO CHANGE IN STRIKE.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 25.—There is no material change in the street railway strike tonight. Directors of the United Railroads are still waiting instructions from New York before replying to the demands of the car men. They expect to be able to formulate a reply tomorrow.

WALLA WALLA, April 25.—William H. Hogan, a switchman at Peco, was killed yesterday by a freight train on the Northern Pacific.
