spicious parts. One duke has been appointed to provide a glove for the king and support this arm; an earl will walk in the procession as Lord High Constable and will carry a silver baton tipped with gold spurs; a baron will carry the canopy over the king; two lords will carry the great spurs; a lord as Lord High Steward of Ireland will provide a glove for the king's right hand and support his arm while holding the sceptre; a duke as "gold stick for Scotland" will ride by the king's carriage; a marquis will carry the cap of maintenance; and a hundred other personages will figure in as many different ceremonies.

A law has been passed regulating the style and length of dress to be worn by the peers and peeresses. The whole will be a gaudy pantomime up to the time when the king takes his oath. Even this portion of the ceremony will be observed under the ancient rules and laws of the country. An archbishop will administer the oath and then the king will be anointed. The crowns of the king and queen will be decked with the richest jewels. In fact, the occasion will be a display of wealth and pomp.

To the English subject, who is familiar with the history of the country and the symbolic meaning of all of the objects displayed and the ceremonies enacted, doubtless finds an occasion which stirs up his patriotism. But to the average American, to whom the word king is a menace and an object of contempt, figuratively speaking, all of this ceremony will appear as so much bombast and buncombe; an exhibition of the power that once ruled with an iron hand against the helpless and unfortunate. He does not see an exhibition of strength of government in such ceremonies, but the calling up of old ancient customs considered out of date in modern civilization.

The American who does not believe in power or office-holding by inheritance, but in a government where every citizen has equal rights to the highest place, and where merit and honesty are the only premiums, prefers the simple ceremony of inaugurating our president every four years from the common citizenship, to the pageantry and spectacular performances at the crowning of a king with an inheritance of names and titles longer than the deeds he has ever performed.
