any act of the legislature must be submitted to the people at the polls for adoption or rejection. The veto power of the governor does not extend to measures referred to the people.

The man with the scheme that will produce riches galore for the "angel" who will furnish the money to carry it out bobs up frequently during the progress of preparing for a World's Fair. Senator Mark Hanna, of Ohio, known generally to be a man of wealth and sagacity could not escape the scheme. A few days ago the senator received the following letter: "On the top of Mount Ararat there is still preserved buried, amid eternal snow, Noah's ark. I am organizing a company to dig it out and bring it to the United States. You can help me to make a lot of money if you will go into the scheme, because the original Noah's ark would be the best paying attraction at the St. Louis World's Fair." Up to the present writing Senator Hanna has not invested in the Noah's ark scheme.

The Portland Commission is having a hard time with its dredging proposition. The Taxpayers' League has confronted the commission with a solid protest. The league says that \$200,000 is too much and to levy that amount would place taxes too high. The proposed dredging which it is estimated will require this sum, extends from Portland to 65 miles this side. In summing up the many needed improvements within the distance named it is ascertained that not less than \$200,000 will be required to even put the river in temporary better condition; it is a sort of bridging over for the time until more substantial improvements can be made. At this rate for temporary navigation it will cost more money than figures can enumerate to fix the channel so that the inland city may be made a seaport.

A strong effort is being made to get the postal currency measure through Congress to supplant the present money order system. It is urged by an advocate of the scheme: "The postal check currency or some other plan should be adopted whereby the transmission of money by mail may be rendered easy and certain. It is remarkable that the country should so long have been compelled to put up with the present very unsatisfactory arrangements for sending money by mail."

Fusion Republicans in Portland are giving it out that as a matter of home pride Portland will go for Chamberlain over W. J. Furnish, just because he happens to live in the same city with him. While Portland is the hub of the state she also claims to be the hub of the Republican party and she is expected to show it in the present campaign.

The Federation of Labor has decided to declare 30 days fast against fresh meats. On account of the high prices effected by the combine on fresh meats it is thought that an abstinence from meat eating for 30 days will bring down the prices.

Receipts come from all points in Clatsop County, and from all over the state so far as that is concerned, the evidence is abundantly favored for the success of the Republican ticket in the present election.
