ALL THEIR PLANS FAILED.

Massachusetts' Club Women Are Gravely Disappointed.

LOS ANGELES, May 6.—Today the Massachusetts club women saw all the plans for which they had been fighting for two years go down before the vote of the convention. A final protest was given to the admission of colored women's clubs; an effort to down the individual club as a step toward reorganizing through state federations only failed, and the plan to reduce the per capita tax from 10 cents to 7 cents was snowed under. The dispatch with which the three issues were defeated, in the midst of intense excitement on both sides, is a matter of surprise even to the delegates who aided in the result.

IT QUICKLY RECOVERED.

Wall Street Now in Its Normal Condition.

NEW YORK, May 6.—Wall street recovered very generally today from the demoralization of yesterday. The stock exchanges whose suspension followed the call money, which rose to 30 per cent Monday, did not advance beyond 12 per cent, and closed at 6 per cent. There were no important developments in the affairs of the three stock exchanges whose suspension followed the collapse in securities controlled by Dr. Seward Webb and Arthur L. Meyer.

BOYCOTTING BEEF.

LYNN, Mass., May 6.—An Anti-Beef Eating League is being organized among five thousand employees of the general electric company here. Between 1000 and 1700 names have already been secured, representing 2500 consumers. Local dealers complain that the consumption of meats is falling off rapidly.

The best previous service for this branch of the postal system allowed but one consignment to Nome each month.
