Word has been received here that the Hancock left Manila on May 27 bringing the headquarters and ten companies of the Ninth Infantry, 413 enlisted men, 50 prisoners and 314 casuals.

PEKIN, June 3.—Fires started yesterday at the French barracks and today at the quarters of the Austrian troops. Damages were small. The fires are said to have been of incendiary origin. There was much excitement and rejoicing among the crowds of Chinese while the buildings were burning.

NOTED MASON DEAD

NEW YORK, June 3.—Peter Ross, L. D., 333 degree Mason, grand histor-

lan of the grand lodge of Masons, this state and the author of many books on free Masonry and Scottish history, is dead at his home in this city, after a long illness. He was born in Edinburgh in 1847. Dr. Ross was for 15 years secretary of the North American Association of Caledonian Clubs.

REBELS CHECKED

VICTORIA, B. C., June 3.—Late advices brought by steamer from Japan are to the effect that the capture of the rebel leader Nung Yung Sung has given a check to Kwangsi rebellion, and the troops sent to the relief of Nan Ning met with very little opposition.

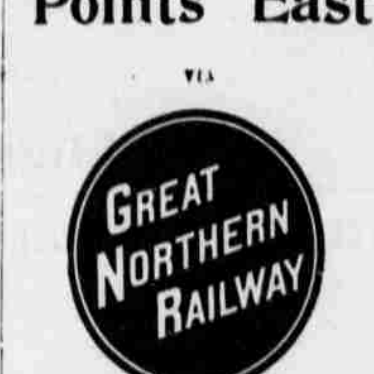
