Taken From Vessel on Arriving in New York—Gift Valued at \$10,000.

NEW YORK, July 7.—There is much excitement on board the ship Attraction, moored at the Morris street dock, Jersey City, owing to the stealing of the most precious thing on board—of an old ship's bell, bearing the inscription "Prince of Wales, 1740."

WILL REDUCE LICENSE.

Council to Fix Slot Machine Tax at Only \$2.50 Per Quarter.

At last night's meeting of the council the committee on health and police, reporting on the petition of the cigar dealers that the slot machine license be reduced, recommended that the license be placed at \$2.50 a quarter.

A communication was received from Olof Anderson, recording secretary of Beaver Lodge, I. O. O. F., calling attention to the condition of Oceanview cemetery, which needed repair.

There was considerable discussion when the mayor's veto of the railroad ordinance was brought up. The ordinance limited the speed of trains to four miles within the city limits.

An ordinance providing for the improvement of Fifteenth street between Commercial and Exchange was passed under suspension. The improvement must be completed by August 25.
