FRENCH BARK BRENN IS SAFE.
Had Been Stated as Lost—Delayed by Adverse Winds.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 22.—The long overdue French bark Brenn, upon which there has been some speculation, the rate of insurance reaching 25 per cent, is at last safe in port from Newcastle, England, having arrived with a cargo of 275 tons of general merchandise. The Brenn, according to Captain Brett's report was of this port for 10 days, most of the time in a dense fog. She had previously been delayed by adverse winds.

LOSES HER LIFE FOR A DOG.
Attempts to Save Pet From Death, She Is Killed.

LA SALLE, Ill., July 22.—Mrs. Ellen Wright of this city lost her life in an attempt to protect her pet dog. She, with her sister, Mrs. John Madison, were walking along the Illinois Central tracks. A passenger train was almost upon the dog, when Mrs. Wright leaped to its rescue. She tossed the animal safely but was unable to avoid the train, which crushed her to death.

AMERICAN HORSES IN DEMAND.
WASHINGTON, July 22.—In the French military service and on French farms American horses are much in demand, according to a report from Commercial Agent Griffith,

at Limoges, dated June 23. He says that care should be taken to send only sound horses to France as on arrival they are carefully examined by veterinarians, who exclude all defective animals.

STEAMER PRIMUS BEING RAISED
HAMBURG, July 22.—The steamer Primus has been partially raised and brought nearer the shore. The total number of missing is now placed at 194. Sixty-one bodies have been recovered.

76 ENLISTED MEN HAVE DIED.
WASHINGTON, July 22.—The war department has been informed from Manila that between May 3 and June 11, 76 enlisted men of the army died. Of these deaths, 62 were caused by cholera.

DEATH OF PIANO MAKER.
CHICAGO, July 22.—Adam Schaff, one of the pioneer piano manufacturers and dealers of Chicago, died at his home last night. He was born in London, England, in 1849. A widow and four children survive him.

LEAVES FOR BARCELONA.
CARACAS, July 21.—The United States cruiser Cincinnati has left this port for Barcelona. The United States gunboat is anchored at LaGuayra.
