

WILL CAUSE MORE WAR MOROS ATTACK AND KILL AMERICAN SOLDIERS.

Ladrones Murder Wm. Schemerhorn of Seattle—Shoot Sentinels While on Duty.

MANILA, Aug. 13.—A small party of Moros surprised an outpost of the Twenty-seventh infantry, at Camp Vickers, yesterday. Sergeant Foley and Private Carey were killed, and Private Vandorn was severely wounded. The Moros, who numbered only a dozen, were armed with spears and swords. The morning was dark and foggy. The attacking party crawled to within a few feet of the sentinels and then sprung upon them suddenly. The entire outpost rushed to the relief of the sentinels, but they were too late, and the Moros escaped, although possibly a few of them were wounded. The American sentinels were terribly cut by the swords and spears. The attacking Moros were all from Bacod, and the occurrence probably will result in a move against the town, which has a strong fort and other defenses.

SEATTLE MAN KILLED. MANILA, Aug. 13.—Constabulary Inspector William Schermerhorn, whose home was in Seattle, was mortally wounded in a recent fight with Ladrones at Iligan, Mindanao.

CHAFFEE REPORTS IT. WASHINGTON, Aug. 13.—The war department is advised by cable from General Chaffee that on August 12, at midnight, 10 or 12 Moros attacked an outpost of Company G, Twenty-seventh infantry, at Camp Vickers, killing Henry C. Carey and James Foley, and wounding two other enlisted men.

THREE PERSONS FATALLY BURNED; ANOTHER INJURED. CHICAGO, Aug. 13.—One woman and a man were probably fatally burned and one man slightly injured early today by a fire which broke out in an upper flat of an apartment building on Park avenue. H. G. Miller was taken to the county hospital, and the woman, Grace Barnett, was removed to the Presbyterian hospital. It is said both will die. Henry Moore, who was scorched while trying to save the others was taken to the county hospital.

BIG DEAL IN FIR AND SPRUCE TIMBER LAND. Michigan Company Buys 11,000 Acres on Oregon Coast. HOUGHTON, Mich., Aug. 13.—The Sparrow-Kroll Lumber Company, of Kenton, Mich., has purchased 11,000 acres of fir and spruce timber land on the coast of Oregon. The deal involves over \$500,000.

GLASS WORKERS UNION GAIN DECIDED VICTORY. PITTSBURG, Aug. 13.—It is reported that the American Flint Glass Workers Union has gained a decided victory in securing from the MacBeth-Evans Glass Company, the only producer of machine made chimneys, a compromise advance for skilled men of the factories of seven per cent in

STUDENT DISCOVERS REMAINS OF PRIMEVAL BEAR

BERKELEY, Cal., Aug. 13.—Eustace L. Furlong, student assistant in the theological department of the University of California, has discovered embedded in the floor of one of the famous limestone caves of Shasta county almost the entire remains of an archæotherium simum, the gigantic primeval bear that was the first of the kind to roam the two American continents. Because only fragments of the skeleton, until now incomplete, have hitherto been discovered by geologists, the work of Furlong ranks as one of the most notable achievements of the university explorers in recent years.

MYSTERIOUS PETER POWER.

Sought Refuge in Canada to Escape Jail Sentence. NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—Peter Power, under sentence of 30 days in jail for contempt of court in connection with the Northern Pacific merger, has disappeared from Montreal and gone toward Quebec, according to a Montreal special to the Press, whether to unite the ancient capital or to board the Beaver line mail steamship Lake Erie, which sails for Liverpool at 4 p. m. Thursday morning, is not known. It is possible he may go to New York, but if he is going there he is taking a roundabout course. When seen, Mr. Power said: "I have no idea of returning to New York in the immediate future, but there is no reason why I should not do so. I mean to stay here for a few days more."

RANCHMEN FOUGHT A DUEL.
