WRONGS WITHOUT REMEDY.

Once in a while there comes to light a case of injustice that is pitiful beyoud expression, because there is no method by which the wrong can be righted, no scheme of reparation possible. Such an instance is embodied in the story of Helen Wagner, who died in Seattle in June while there was pending in the circuit court in Seattle her appeal from a conviction of grand larceny. The crime had occurred in Shortly after the death of the Woman her prosecutor was arrested for perjury, and the fact of her innocence became clear. It is alleged that the witness was hired to swear away the liberty of the woman against whom two gamblers had a grudge, and that by mistake he wreaked their vengeance upon another woman. She was adjudged guilty, and died while the shadow of disgrace was hanging over her. As to the character of the victim, the dispatches say nothing. and, indeed, this is a matter of no consequence in this connection. If she was snared in a net of perjury, the perjurers are creatures more vile than have any right to live. There is no law to reach them. It would be difficult to convict them of the murder for which, morally, they are culpable,

and no sentence to jail could be adequate punishment.

Exceptions have occur taken to Mr. Gomper's address wherein he sought to justify the workingman's requests for "more and more," says the Journal. The request is not a very strange one since it is the essence of the world's ambition in these ciping prosperous times. It is natural, and doubly so from the workers' point of view. Is he not worth more and more every day from the time he begins to labor: While he descands more and more he does not and cannot get it except his services be worth it. But to take it more in the sense to which some take exceptions to it, is it aught but just? It would give to labor the products of labor. It could not withhold from any man what was justly his own. vertisers the largest circulation of any it could not deny an equal privilege to any man who would work. Labor would then be the world's capital and it could not be cornered and controlled, The only possible bugaboo is the vision of work to those who are now idlers. Labor unions will keep demanding and taking more until the ill-gotten, but colossal gains of men who perform no beneficial or other capitalists are gonig about to help labor are reduced. It would be perfectly awful if some persons in this world had to work, but if they did they would soon learn to use their earnings to a better purpose. Labor denies nothing to the laborer. It denics everything to the idler. In union is strength. Let us hasten the work.
