

HEIRS COME TO TERMS

RELATIVES OF MRS. FAIR NOT TO ENTER COURT.

Sum of \$500,000 Paid to Her Kinfolks—Sisters Receive Fair's Estate.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 28.—Although the heirs of the late Mr. and Mrs. Charles Fair have reached an agreement, it will be six months or a year before all the legal arrangements can be perfected.

All the terms of the adjustment will not be made public, but the attorneys state that the relatives of Mrs. Fair will receive the full value of her estate, which has been estimated at \$500,000.

HALF MILLION THE SUM.

\$500,000 Said to Have Been Paid to Mrs. Fair's Relatives.

CHICAGO, Aug. 28.—A special to the Record-Herald from San Francisco says:

There will be no contests over the estates of either Charles Fair or his wife, Mrs. Fair's relatives, Mrs. Harriet E. Nelson, mother of Mrs. Fair, on behalf of herself and her children, has relinquished for a sum in cash all the claims to the estates of Fair or his wife.

By the terms of the compact the estate of Charles L. Fair goes entirely to his relatives, Mrs. Herman Oelrichs and Mrs. W. K. Vanderbilt, jr., who will also receive all Mrs. Fair's property.
