WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY.

LONDON, Sept. 23.—Steps are being taken on the initiative of Germany with the view of holding in October an international conference with the powers on the subject of wireless telegraphy. The purpose of the conference is to establish the general principle of an international agreement. Germany advances the view that as the practical working of wireless telegraphy is now assured the system should in public interests be subjected to rules similar to those laid down in the international telegraph convention.

NEW YORK, Sept. 23.—A man who gave his name as Otto A. Plur, but who the police says is known as "Pyrot," has been arrested here on dispatches from San Francisco, saying he is wanted for swindling.

COREA IS POOR.

SEOUL, Korea, Sept. 23.—The celebration of the anniversary of the coronation of the emperor, Yi Hieung, has been postponed in consequence of it. It is said the spread of cholera here, but it is alleged that the real reason lack of funds.
