The cargo shipments of lumber from the Columbia river for the first nine months of 1992 aggregated 71,592,306 feet, as compared with 54,861,656 for the corresponding period of the previyear, showing a gain of ous 17,739,659 feet, in spite of the fact that the foreign shipments fell oft 9,226,330 feet during that time. The remarkable increase in the coastwise shipments which grew from 15,151,406 feet to 41,438,386 feet or 273 per cent, is responsible for the net gain. The most remarkable feature is the fact that 11,335,135 feet or 25 per cent of the total coast shipments went to Redondo and San Pedro, while last year only one cargo of 550,000 feet went to Southern California. There should also be included in these figures the piling rafts of the Oregon Rafting company and the Robertson Rafting company which contained about 12,500,000 feet.

Oregon's principal lines of production will yield \$44,000,000 this year, Of this total Clatson's share is more than \$2,000,000, or about one-fifteenth Clatsop's population is only one-thirty-fourth of that of the state.
