Some interesting facts are brought out in the statistics recently made public showing the number of labor disputes in the United Kingdom during 1901. There were fewer strikes during that year, and the strikes and lock-outs that did happen, says the British Board of Trade, in its annual report, were not remarkable by reason of the magnitude. Notwithstanding this encouraging statement, with which the report opens, it appears that there was a total of 642 strikes to be dealt with during the year involving 180,000 employees or about 2 per cent of the industrial population.
