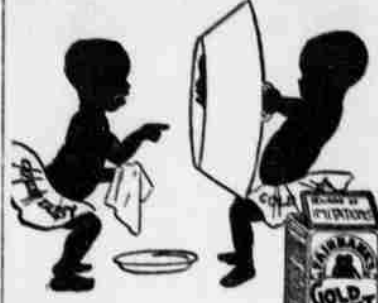
The French chamber of deputies, in session at Paris, determined to try the American plan of settling labor disputes. It's about time Paris was retaliating.

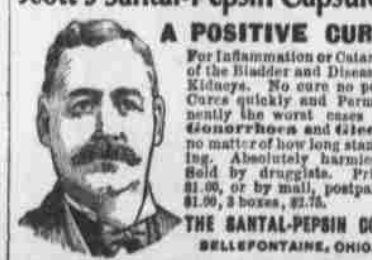
