KANSAS CITY, Nov. 11.—Dr. W. A. Kimberly a prominent oculist, was shot this afternoon by John Scanlon, a former policeman, who then shot and killed himself. Scanlon asserted, it is said, that Kimberly had caused him to lose his eyesight.

POSTAL RECEIPTS FOR OCTOBER.
Statistics Show an Increase of 18 Percent Over a Year Ago.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—Statistics of the gross postal receipts of the government for last month, as compared with October 1901, at 50 of the largest postoffices in the country, show a total of \$5,590,539, an increase of 18 percent. The largest increase was 26 percent at Los Angeles, while the largest decrease was 11 percent at Buffalo.

LINERS ECOUNTER STORMS.
Tacoma and Indrapura Reach Orient After Hard Voyage.

VICTORIA, B. C., Nov. 11.—The steamer Empress of China from the Orient brought advices of a terrible voyage of the liners Tacoma and Indrapura, the former from Victoria and the latter from Portland. The Tacoma spent 23 days in reaching Yokohama, nine days longer than usual and the Indrapura was 24 days from Astoria to Yokohama in consequence of storms.

KAISER'S VISIT REGARDED WITH OPEN SUSPICION.
Press Warns Ministers to be on Guard as to Granting Colonial Concessions.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—The English press continues to regard the German emperor's visit with suspicion and distrust, cables the London correspondent of the Tribune. He is not lampooned or caricatured, but it is generally assumed that he is here for business purposes and that he must not be allowed to have what he wants. The conjectures respecting his mission differ widely but the conclusion is the same in every instance, namely that the ministers must be on their guard and decline all overtures for joint action of England and Germany whether in East Africa, Asia Minor or the Yangtze valley.

LUNATIC ATTACKS SURGEON.
Pierce Struggle Occurs in Rapidly Driven Ambulance.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—A terrible struggle in which Dr. Hyde of Bellevue hospital was seriously injured, occurred in an ambulance while the vehicle was being driven rapidly through the streets of this city.

GENERAL STRIKE THREATENED.
Employes Demand That Blacklisted Officials Be Reinstated.

TAMAQUA, PA., Nov. 11.—At a meeting of the employes of the Lehigh Coal and Navigation company a committee was appointed to wait upon W. D. Zehner, the superintendent and inform him that unless the 218 officials of the various locals in the Panther Creek Valley, who, it is alleged, have been blacklisted, are reinstated in their old positions before the end of the week, a general strike will be ordered.

SUCCESS IN MAKING ESCAPE.
Overpower Keeper in Broad Daylight—New Jail Will Be Built.

TUCSON, ARIZ., Nov. 11.—Forty prisoners confined in the jail at Cananea overpowered the jailers and escaped in broad daylight. The men were charged with different offenses ranging from petty larceny to murder. This is the second jail delivery in a month and a new prison is being cut out of the side of the mountain, where escape will be well nigh impossible.

CHAMPION WRESTLING MATCH.
NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—Articles have been signed for a wrestling match here on November 25 for the championship of the world, between Thomas Jenkins, who now claims to be catch-as-catch-can champion of the world, and Joseph Carroll, who holds the championship of England and Ireland. The articles call for the best two in three falls with no hold barred.

BOSTON CLUB MAN DISCHARGED.
Held for a Time for Murder—Allan G. Mason Is Now Free.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Nov. 11.—Allan G. Mason, the Boston club man charged with the murder of Clara Morton of Waverly, was discharged today.

WRECKED PASSENGERS SAVED.
WELLINGTON, N. Z., Nov. 11.—The steamer Zealandia has picked up one boat and two rafts from the British steamer Elangamite, carrying 79 passengers. Three boats from Elangamite are still missing.

Baer's statement is a general denial of the statement of the miners' side of the case as given by President Mitchell, and sets forth at length the position of the coal company with reference to its employes.
