egrapher bearing a telegram from President Castro to the commandant of San Carlos, landed on the island and entered the fort. The walls of the fort are terribly hammered and show many evidences of the firing.

The village of San Carlos suffered greatly. The aim of the German gunners appeared to have been inaccurate for more than 60 percent of the shells exploded in the village before reaching the fort. The cannon mounted at San Carlos have not sufficient range to reach the Falke and Vineta, so the fire from these vessels was not returned, as they kept out of range of the Venezuelan artillery. The Vineta and Falke are of too great draft to cross the bar. The Panther alone can do this, and this fact explains why the last mentioned cruiser was the only one to come in close to the fort.

General Bello, commander of the fort, is a soldier of remarkable courage and daring. He will not abandon the fort, but will resist as long as it is possible for him to do so. He swears that on January 17, the occasion of the fort bambardment, the Panther fired upon him first without provocation.

TEACHERS GET INCREASE.




