YOSEMITE WATER FOR 'FRISCO

Project Involves Bringing Water 140 Miles at a Cost of \$40,000,000.

New York, March 25.—Hon. Franklin K. Lane recently a candidate for governor of California, and the city attorney for San Francisco, is in New York. His mission in coming east is to secure from the department of the interior the right to use two reservoir sites on the Yosemite National park as a source of water supply for San Francisco. Applications were made for these sites two years ago by the mayor, but was rejected. The city now renews the application in its own name. If they are granted the water supply will be owned by the municipality.

Plans and estimates have already been made which call for an expenditure of \$40,000,000. In general outline the scheme is to hold back in giant reservoirs the waste flood waters of the Tuolumne river, and by canals and pipes carry the water across the San Joaquin valley and under San Francisco bay, a distance of 140 miles.

The new charter of San Francisco makes it mandatory that the question of municipal ownership of the water supply shall be submitted to the vote of the people, and it is in conformity with that direction that the plans of the Tuolumne project have been made.

HEAVY DAMAGES ARE ASKED.

Explosion of Fireworks on Election Night Causes Injuries Placed at \$50,000.

New York, March 25.—Claims against the city for heavy damages for personal injuries received at Madison square on last election night when several bombs exploded in the crowd during the fireworks celebration, have begun to appear in the office of the city controller. One for \$25,000 damages was by Samuel Melker, a youth who was severely injured, has been filed. Other claims will swell the total to about \$50,000, and suits will be instituted in each case if they are not settled by the controller.

WILL AID JEWISH IMMIGRANTS

Society for Inducing New Arrivals to Seek Homes in the West.

Chicago, March 25.—The Chronicle today says:

Jews who migrate to the United States and come to Chicago to make their homes will be invited to continue on their journey westward, if the plans of the Chicago Removal Industrial society, which was organized last night, succeed.

Chicago Jews expect the movement to result in great good. They say the congested district of the ghetto will be relieved and that the Jews will be urged to seek homes in the country, in the villages and small cities of the west.

The organization is similar to one in New York. Offices will be established in the ghetto district. Correspondence with manufacturers in the smaller cities and villages will be conducted and an attempt will be made to secure positions for the Jews who would like to leave Chicago.

EX-GOVERNOR OF LOWER CALIFORNIA

Died Suddenly After Giving Over the Reins of Government to His Successor.

San Diego, Cal., March 25.—A special to the Union from Ensenada, Lower California, says:

Ex-Governor Abraham Arrona is dead here, after an illness lasting only a few hours. Colonel Arrona last week turned the government of this, the northern district of Lower California, over to his successor, Colonel Voga of Sonora, and intended to sail Sunday evening for San Diego on his way to his new station at La Paz. At the last moment he was taken ill and had to abandon the trip. He was 70 years of age and a native of San Luis Potosi.
