9 EX-GOVERNOR OF LOWER CALIFORNIA

Died Suddenly After Gving Over the Reins of Government to His Successor.

San Diego, Cal., March 25.-A special. to the Union from Ensanada, Lower California, says:

Ex-Governor Abraham Arronia is dead here, after an illness lasting only a few hours. Colonel Arroniz last week turned the government of this. the northern district of Lower California, over to his successor, Colonel Voga of Sonora, and intended to sail Sunday evening for San Diego on his way to his new station at La Paz. At the last moment he was taken ill and had to abandon the trip. He was 70 years of age and a native of San Luis Potosi.
