THE HOME OF THE WHITE CEDAR

(By the Late A. A. J. Johnson, Government Forestry Expert.)

White cedar, known botanically as *Chamaecyparis Lawsoniana*, is the most valuable of the cedar species found in Oregon. This timber is found in Coos, Curry, Douglas and part of Josephine counties, on the west side of the Coast Range mountains. White Cedar is an evergreen, with bluish green foliage, with rather rough bark on the older trees, while on the younger growth the bark is comparatively smooth. The wood is a creamy white, with a close grain, is susceptible of a high polish, durable and strong.

White cedar possesses the finest qualities commercially of any timber known to commerce. The trees attain a height of 200 feet and over, and will run from three to 10 feet in diameter on the stump. The percentage of clear lumber in the butt logs is ordinarily very high. In fact it is not uncommon to find trees where the first two or three logs make nearly clear lumber. Unlike red cedar the trees are usually sound and free from hollow butts. The lumber has a very delightful and highly aromatic odor, which makes it very valuable for shelving, clothes closets and chests where valuable furs or clothing are kept, as its odor is an absolute preventative from the attacks of moths. The wood is seemingly free from pitch, but contains an oil which it exudes and forms a wax.

For ship-building purposes this timber is highly prized, as its lasting qualities cannot be equalled by any species of timber in North America. Vessels that were constructed of white cedar on Coos bay over 40 years ago are still as sound as the day they were built, the essential oil in the wood seeming to act as a most potent and efficacious preservative.

The total area of white cedar in Oregon will approximate from 175,000 to 200,000 acres in extent. The largest body yet untouched lies between Coos bay and the Coquille river, a distance of some 20 miles.

The average stand of white cedar will run from 15,000 to 20,000 feet to the acre. In some isolated cases the timber will run as high as 100,000 feet to the acre, but this is exceptional. Botanists are generally agreed that this species of timber is about 700 years old. Oregon may well feel proud that she has among her timber family the stately and valuable white cedar, the equal of which as a lumber tree is not extant.

HAPPY PORTO RICO.

Some interesting information as to condition of one of our new possessions, to-wit, the Island of Porto Rico, is afforded by James S. Harlan, who has just returned to the United States after serving two years as attorney-general there. The most important thing is that the island is not only out

of debt, but has a surplus of half a million dollars in the treasury. Mr. Harlan says he knows no other state or territory in this condition. Porto Rico is favored in this respect, that what the people pay in taxes remains on the island and is not sent abroad, as when she was under Spanish dominion. Spain found her a "rich port," indeed. The island's total income is \$2,300,000. She has been helped materially by coming under United States control.

TO ALL PERSONS IN CLATSOP COUNTY.

Bridge Proposals

Notice is hereby given that plans, specifications, strain diagrams and bids will be received by the county court of Clatsop county, state of Oregon, until 5 p. m., Tuesday, May 5th, 1903, for the building, construction and erection of a drawbridge across the Lewis and Clark river in Clatsop county, Oregon, according to such plans, specifications and diagrams.

Location of bridge is shown on maps now on file in the county clerk's office as approved by the Hon. Secretary of war.

Bridge to be a steel swinging draw bridge with a clear space of 70 feet on each side of the draw rest. As is also directed by the Hon. secretary of war.

Approaches to be pile trestle with a 15 foot clear road or driveway. Bidders shall attach to their bid a certified check equal to 10 percent of the same and check made payable to the order of the county clerk or may deposit the amount in cash at time of filing his or their bid.

Said check or cash to be forfeited to the county of Clatsop, state of Oregon, if after an award is made or bid is accepted said bidder fails or refuses for a period of two days to enter into contract and file a bond as may be required by the county court aforesaid.

Payments for said bridge to be made by warrants drawn on a special fund created by the county court of Clatsop county, Oregon, at their regular term in January, 1903, same being a levy of 1 1/2 mills on the dollar for a term of four years. Bids to be sealed and marked "Proposals for Draw Bridge across the Lewis and Clark River," and filed in the office of the county clerk.

The county court, however, reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
