The water commission met last night and authorized the extension of the 6-inch main from Hanthorn's cannery east on Forty-second and Bond streets to Forty-sixth street, the present terminus of the streetcar line. Bills ordered paid at last night's meeting amounted to \$258.97 and the pay roll of the business for the month just past was shown to be \$236.85.
