**CHARGED WITH SAFE ROBBERING.**  
 Robbers Employed Magnifying Glass  
 to Study Combination.  
 Birmingham Ala., May 28.—Bennett  
 Bibb and James Williamson are under  
 arrest here charged with robbing the  
 safe in the Union passenger station  
 and ticket office of nearly \$7000. The  
 detectives are after another man whose  
 arrest, they believe, will bring about  
 the recovery of the money, or a large  
 part of it.  
 The arrests developed the most in-  
 genious scheme known to the detectives  
 who have been working on the case.  
 A hole was bored through the ceiling  
 of the office and from above the alleged  
 burglars studied the combination  
 through a magnifying glass.

**POSTAL FRAUDS CONTAGIOUS**

Postmaster in Philippines Stole the  
 Money and Safe.  
 Washington May 28.—The Philippines  
 are having their postal scandals as  
 well as Washington. Two cases are re-  
 ported by mail to the war department.  
 One is that of ex-Postmaster Milne at  
 Tacloban, Leyte, who is accused not  
 only of taking \$2000 current coin of the  
 United States, but even the 400 pound  
 safe which is supposed to have con-  
 tained the money.  
 When the robbery was first reported  
 on November 24 last, suspicion was di-  
 rected by Milne to certain discharged  
 soldiers engaged in business in Taclo-  
 ban. Investigation proved their inno-  
 cence and resulted in Milne's arrest.

A Merchant, a prominent Coos Bay  
 business man who went out on the Al-  
 bion yesterday said that 45 years ago  
 when Portland had but one business  
 street he could keep track of himself  
 then, but that on his recent visit to  
 that metropolis he managed to get lost  
 several times. He thought the town  
 had either grown considerably or he  
 was growing old.
