Regular Meeting Of City Council

City Dads Turn Out Small Grist—Improvements Of The Streets Will Continue.

In the absence of Mayor Suprenant Councilman Jens H. Hanson presided at the regular meeting of the city fathers last evening. The mayor is at St. Marth's springs, near the Cascades, seeking health.

The Clatsop Mill Co, on a bill of \$124.30 for lumber for sidewalk on Scow bay was allowed \$125.

Police Judge Anderson reported the fines and forfeitures for May to be \$973. Total receipts of his office \$987.30.

A resolution introduced by Councilman Nordstrom was adopted directing the committee on ways and means to call for bids to be presented at the next regular meeting codifying and publishing the city charter and ordinances, which have not been codified since 1898, since which time a new charter has been obtained and may ordinances enacted.

The committee on streets reported the drain in Forty-fourth street to be in a bad condition, recommending repairs and the construction of a sewer. City Surveyor Tee was instructed to investigate.

The purchasing committee was instructed to wire concerning the non-appearance of the roller ordered for use on macadam streets to try to rush the delivery, as the streets are torn up and almost impassable and cannot be finished without it.

A bill of sale was filed conveying to the city the title to sewer pipe put in on First street by Chas. E. Johnson.

On the petition of property owners for the improvement of Franklin avenue from Schofield & Haucke's store to Alderbrook the committee reported recommending that the city surveyor investigate the proposition and report as to the ability of the district to afford the improvement. Also that plans and specifications be prepared to enable the introduction of a resolution for the improvement at the next meeting. It is desired that the street be built of macadam if considered feasible.

The committee on fire and water reported having turned in to the city \$250, the result of the sale of the old teams of No. 1 fire company for \$75, and of No. 2 for \$175.

Applications for retail liquor licenses were received from Swan Wilson, Lee Herring and Johnston & Loughery. Liquor licenses were granted to Henry Disse, Manson & Tyberg and R. J. Owens.

Chairman Burns of the street committee stated that it had been intended to present a resolution for the improvement of Exchange street from Fourteenth street to Seventeenth, but that objections had been made by property owners to making the improvement on the established grade which makes the south side of the street higher than the north side. It was suggested by the city surveyor that the difficulty be overcome by building the street level transversely, except at and near the established crossings, which could be made to conform with the established grade.
