**RICH, AND DIDN'T KNOW IT.**

Poor Constable Finds He is Heir to Large Fortune.

New York, June 10.—Living in moderate circumstances for 18 years, during which time he was totally ignorant of any claim to wealth, John Manley, a constable of Plainfield, N. J., has learned that he is heir to Long Island property valued at several hundred thousand dollars. He only learned of the inheritance through an offer from a railroad company to purchase his equity in a piece of land. Upon further investigation, he learned that his father who died in 1880, owned two tracts near Long Island City. In foreclosure proceedings after the owner's death, Manley's name was in some manner omitted from the list of heirs.

**INSURANCE DEFRAUDERS.**

Merchant and Agent Arrested Before Much Loss.

Vienna, June 10.—Alois G. Rabanez, a merchant, and Anton Caeric, an agent, have been arrested at Trieste on the charge of defrauding a New York insurance company by effecting an insurance on the lives of sick persons and then acquiring an interest in the policy for small sums. They insured seven persons for a total policy of \$68,000. The company paid the first claim for \$3000, but discovered the conspiracy in the second case in which a man named Anton Petschek was insured for \$12,000. Petschek revealed the plot shortly before death, stating that he had sold the interest in the policy to the prisoners for \$400.

**TRIED TO ROAST HIMSELF.**

Act of Crazy Second Mate Endangered the Vessel.

Seattle, June 10.—James Johnson, second mate of the schooner Stinson, which arrived at Ballard yesterday from San Francisco, wrapped himself in sacks saturated with oil when the vessel was off the Washington coast and crawled in the hold for self-cremation. Lighting the oil he was roasted almost to death before he was discovered, and he died just as the vessel reached port. His act endangered the whole ship, but the flames were discovered in time. Religious fanaticism is given as the cause. The memory returned to him of butcheries in which he had taken part, it is said, in the Philippines.

**VASSAR SENIOR CLASS DAY.**

Historic Spade, Used by Founder of College, Passed Around.

Poughkeepsie, N. Y., June 10.—The senior class of Vassar college has held class day exercises out of doors. After the usual procession and an address of welcome by Elizabeth Burd Thompson, of Allegheny, president of the senior class, the procession marched to the class tree where the historic spade, used by Matthew Vass in turning the sod when the college was founded, was handed by the senior class to the junior class. Later the annual luncheon of the alumni association was given. President Hadley of Yale was among the speakers.

**MARINE ITEMS.**

The British tramp steamer Oakley went up the river yesterday with rails for the Southern Pacific Railway. The cargo comes from Antwerp.

The steamer Elmore sailed with a good cargo yesterday morning for Tillamook.

The schooner Virginia went up the river late yesterday afternoon. She will load lumber at the North Pacific mill.

The Bienn-Waldo Lumber company, of Westport, will load the schooner Alvenna, which left up yesterday afternoon.

The barkentine Quickstep, which arrived in a few days ago, is having a record loading at the Columbia mill, Vancouver, Wash. The river has risen so high that the mill has had to close down, and the lumber on the dock is now threatened. This has caused great efforts to be made to give the Quickstep quick dispatch. She will take half a million feet of ties and lumber for Redondo.

The steam schooners Acme and Homer left up early yesterday morning.

The schooner John A. cleared yesterday for San Francisco with a cargo of lumber from Portland.

The British ship Drumburton will sail for Manila this morning with lumber.

The French bark Donna Francisca will leave out tomorrow. She carries 130,420 bushels of wheat exported by the Portland Grain company, and goes to Queenstown for orders.

The steam schooner Despatch left out yesterday with lumber for San Francisco. The Despatch was delayed 24 hours owing to the death of Olaf Johnson, the member of the crew who died from sunstroke.

The steamer Telephone, which is being extensively overhauled, is expected to be about the fastest boat on the Columbia when she goes on her run again.

The Catamaran steamer Advance of Portland seems to be a success. The Advance is split in two from stem to stern, and in the intervening space run endless chains with buckets attached, which dip into the water and force the vessel along.

The steamer Hassalo has been passed by the United States inspectors.

**OREGON MEETS CUT RATES.**

The rate war on wheat and flour for the orient that started in San Francisco and spread to the sound has now involved the Portland and Asiatic company which has announced that the new rates will be effective on shipments by the Indrapura, due to sail from Astoria June 28. The rates are only for June shipments at present but will probably be extended, if present indications are reliable. Already it is evident that the Indrapura's cargo will consist mainly of flour, which under the new rates goes at \$3 instead of \$5.
