BEAUTIFUL MONUMENT

A Woodmen of the World monument arrived by steamer from Portland yesterday and is to be erected by Astoria camp to the memory of Adolph L. Larson who died last April. The design is a most beautiful and appropriate one. It represents a tree broken off about 8 feet from the ground. Its sides are covered with natural bark about which cluster ferns and vines. On a smooth portion of the bark is inscribed the name and age of the deceased and the words: "Here Lies a Woodman of the World" Below this inscription appear the latin words: "Dum Tacet Clamat," meaning "though silent, he speaks." About the inscription are carved a beetle, ax and wedge, emblematic of the order. Soon after it is erected it will, on a pre-arranged date, be unveiled with a beautiful ceremony.

This is the second monument erected by Astoria camp to the memory of deceased members. As is well known, the Woodmen of the World erect a monument to the memory of each deceased member.
