There is a belief in the west that s recent ruling of the postoffice department will seriously cripple the rural free delivery of mails. The ruling is to the effect that no free-delivery route shall be continued unless 106 fam ilies are served and 3,000 pieces of mail matter are handled monthly. Under this ruling it is said, 90 per cent of the routes in Nebraska, Minnesota, Iowa and the Dakotas will be discontinued, says the Chicago Inter-Ocean.

There may have been too rapid exter sion of the free-delivery service in some of the states. Many of the routes may full below the standard con templated under the law under which better boat. The best a edicine in the they were established and there may have been reckless expenditure in extending 'he system. But it is undeniable that the extension of the freedelivery service has been of greta benefit to our rural population.

It has been more than a convenience and has done much to reconcile the boys and girls to farm life. Taken in connection with the farm telephone and the electric railroad, the rural free delivery of mails has given a new at mosphere to country life and no govermental policy has been more popular in the west than that under liberal expenditures have been made to give the farmer free delivery of

Therefore necessary changes in the system should be made with great care An arbitrary ruling that would suspend 90 per cent of the rural free-deivery mail routes would create great dissatisfaction and would be manifestly unjust. It is not a question of whether or not too much money has been spent on the routes. When free-deliv ery was extended in cities the convenience of the people was the consid

At first the free-delivery system in the cities did not pay, but it was not uspended on that account. It was not expected that the rural free-delivery system would pay at first.
