Are Preparing For The Races

Believed That Lipton Will Again Be Defeated In His Fight For Cup

BETTING FAVORS RELIANCE

EVERYTHING IS FAVORABLE FOR THE BIG YACHT CONTEST TO BE PULLED OFF TODAY

New York, August 19.—Over an ocean race course outside Sandy Hook Sir Thomas Lipton's third challenger, Shamrock III, tomorrow will try conclusions with the defender of the America's cup, the Reliance. It is expected that one of the very largest crowds which ever witnessed an international cup race will go out and witness the initial race for the blue ribbon of the sea.

The United States government will police the course with revenue cutters and the most stringent rules will be laid down to prevent interference by an excursion fleet with big single stickers.

Like greyhounds in the leash, the big racers are moored tonight inside Sandy hook ready for the fray tomorrow.

Both were given their final trial spins today. Despite the big time allowance which the defender must concede to the challenger, friends of the Reliance are extremely confident that Sir Thomas is again subject to defeat and confidence in the American boat is reflecting in betting where odds are two to one on the Reliance. Friends of the British boat, on the other hand, profess the greatest faith in the ability of Fife's latest creation to lift the cup.

Greatest Of Encampments

Sixty Thousand Visitors Are In San Francisco to Attend G. A. R. Reunion;

San Francisco, Aug. 19.—What, with receptions and entertainments of all kinds, the visiting members of the G. A. R. are having a most enjoyable time in the city. The old veterans have been extended a hearty welcome on all sides and everywhere they have hospitality extended to them.

Train after train still add its complement to the army of veterans already marshalled here and the encampment now begins to assume the proportions of the largest ever held in the history of the organization. The arrivals now are computed at 21,000 people from Eastern points with fully 35,000 persons in addition from California points.

PEACE CELEBRATION

APPOINTEES NAMED TO SERVE ON THE BOARD OF PHILIPPINE ISLAND COMMISSIONERS

Manila, P. I., August 19, 10 a. m.—The Philippine commission has appointed Captain George T. Langhorne of the Eleventh cavalry, secretary to the provincial government of the province of Moro, and Captain Keeler engineer officer, both of the new appointees to receive an addition of 20 per cent to their army pay.

Major Robert L. Bullard, with the assistance of the friendly Moro chiefs is making arrangements for a grand celebration and peace conference on the completion of the Lanao military road.

SAYS STORY IS FALSE

Wm. Frazee, a member of the Alpine Employment Agency, No. 152 First street, Portland, was in the city yesterday and took part in the Woodmen exercises as a member of the Portland camp. Mr. Frazee claims that the story told by William Henige to the deputy district attorney here a few days ago is very misleading and in fact, untrue. The Alpine Employment Agency, so Mr. Frazee states, collected of young Henige a fee of \$1 but gave him a railroad ticket from Portland to Astoria which cost \$2. It is claimed that Henige was also told that if he failed to get the job to which he was directed the \$1 would be returned. Mr. Frazee said yesterday that he would try and ascertain for himself whether or not there is such a firm as L. R. Everett & Co. in Astoria.

MURDER OR ACCIDENTAL

Salt Lake, Aug. 19.—Elijah Lewis, aged 19, a private in the Twenty-second battery stationed at Fort Douglas, but now in camp near Provo, was shot and instantly killed in camp last night. Whether he was killed as a result of a quarrel between himself and L. W. Burden a member of the same battery who was the only witness to the shooting, or met death through the careless handling of a revolver, is not known. Burden is under arrest pending an investigation of the affair by a board of inquiry. He claims the shooting was accidental. Lewis enlisted in Kentucky.

MUST HAVE SANITARY CERTIFICATES

Stanford University, Cal., Aug. 19.—As a result of the typhoid fever epidemic last year a notice has been sent from the president's office to all student boarding houses as follows: "Students will be allowed to take rooms only in those boarding houses which have a certificate of satisfactory sanitary examination made or endorsed by Dr. William F. Snow, resident taking rooms in houses not thus approved will be excluded from the university. This action on the part of the university authorities is taken in accordance with the advice of the board of health of Santa Clara county."
