REPORT OF GREAT NORTHERN

Gratifying Progress Shown to Have Been Made.

New York, Oct. 2.—The annual pamphlet report of the Great Northern railroad was issued today. The report of President Hill gives minute details as to the condition of the system, but no reference is made to the Northern Securities Company's suit.

During the past year the company has opened for operation the Dakota and Great Northern in Montana, and the Great Northern in Washington, and the Great Northern Vancouver-Victoria and Eastern and the Crow's Nest Southern.

The revenue from the freight hauled increased \$3,000,000 and the earnings of passenger trains increased \$1,100,000.
