Russians Are Angry With Us
Indignant Because Treaty Was Concluded for Opening of Port of Mukden.

New York, Oct. 20.—The Russians are very indignant with the United States government for concluding a treaty to open Mukden to the commerce of the world, cables the Chief correspondent of the Herald. They say, he asserts, that the St. Petersburg government will protest and maintain that the opening of this new treaty port will never take place.

NO CHANCE OF TROUBLE.
New York, Oct. 20.—Admiral Alex-leff, viceroy of the far east, seems indisposed, cables the Herald's Port Arthur correspondent, to discuss the opening of Mukden as a treaty port.

New York, Oct. 20.—United States Consul-General Steinhart, at Havana, has arrived here with the idea in view of interesting business men in the Cuban reciprocity treaty.

AN ECONOMICAL IRISHMAN
Worked 32 Years, Spent \$44.90 and Saved a Fortune.
New York, Oct. 20.—Patrick Mahaney of Derby, Conn., has sailed for his old home in Ireland with \$200, representing the savings of 32 years as a farm hand. His wages generally were \$12 a month and board. In the 32 years he has had but three employers and took only six day off. His expenditures amounted to \$44.90, an average of less than 12 cents a month. This money he spent principally for newspapers. Mahaney said he had enough to live on comfortably and said he never would work again.

BOY KILLED WHILE HUNTING.
Seattle, Oct. 20.—Peter G. Bowen, aged 16 years, a logger working in a

camp between Kanasket and Palmer, met death Sunday afternoon by the accidental discharge of a gun while he was out hunting. He was accompanied by Oxford Johnson, who was employed in the camp. After Bowen was wounded Johnson started to carry the boy to his house, about a mile distant. When about half way home Bowen died and the corpse was carried the rest of the way by Johnson.

TO HANG FOR OTHERS' CRIME
Aged Chinese Assumes Responsibility for Murder.
Vancouver, B. C., Oct. 20.—Three Chinese are charged with the murder of another Chinese, at French Bar, last summer. The trial will begin at Clinton, B. C., on Wednesday. It is said that the two younger of the prisoners have induced the third and oldest to accept the onus of the crime. The provincial police say that, following a Chinese custom, the two younger prisoners have paid the old man for his life.
