THE SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

City Surveyor Tee yesterday filed his annual report in the office of the auditor. The report is an exhaustive one and contains some important recom mendations as to municipal improvements. Mr. Tee commends the more permanent system of improvement inaugurated during the year, and express es the conviction that property owners will find macadamized readways and cement walks much the cheaper in the courage the building of wooden streets. A more extensive street department is urged in Mr. Tee's report. The department, he says, should be divided into two branches a street repair department and a street cleaning department. The repair department should attend promptly to all repairs and have on hand for immediate use and other material to improve highstreet cleaning department should be made up of two or three men, two horses a rotary street broom, one or two onehorse dump carts and the necessary hand scrapers and brooms to clean macadamized streets and cement sidewaiks.
