
The mandate of the supreme court in the case of Reid, Murdock & Co. va. the Alaska Fishermen's Packing Company has been received. It reverses the decision of the lower court and orders the case remanded back for a new trial. The case is an interesting one and grew out of the fact that a broker who handled salmon for the Alaska Fishermen's Packing Company made a contrast with Reid, Murdock & Co. for the sale of Puget sound sockeye salmon. The contract was subject to confirmation by the local company, which refused to confirm. 'It agreed, however, to submit samples of red Alaska. which could be accepted or rejected at the pleasure of Reid, Murdock & Co., the price, if accepted, to be \$1 per dozen. The home company did not pack this variety, never agreed to deliver them, and suit was brought to recover the difference between the market price of the two grades of salmon. A consignment of salmon from the Ataska Fishermen was attached by Reid, Murdock & Co. in Chicago, but bonds were furnished and the goods released. Suit was then brought in the Illinois courts, and resulted in a victory for the Astoria corporation. Then Reid, Murdock & Co. brought sult here, with the same result. The mandate of the supreme court now opens up the whole matter, and the case will probabiy be tried at the next term of court.


