Professo Stillman arrived in Chicago today and will leave this evening for Palo Alto with the body of his daughter.

New York, Jan. 4 .- The Revista Aztucarera, organ of the sugar manufacturers, complains, according to a Herald dispatch from Buenos Ayres, that obstacles of all kinds are interposed by the American authorities to the importation of Argentina products, especially sugar.

The paper asserts that in the New York customs house there is a small lot of sugar-about 400 barrels-which has not yet been delivered for one cause or another. It also declares the United States is systematically excluding Argentine wool and hides.
