## FACILITIES IMPROVED

Salmon Packing Houses Will Be Able to Handle Much Larger Output This Year.

### NEW CANNERY AT ALTOONA

Plant Will Be Operated There to Take Care of Surplus Supply of Other Canneries—Packers to Have Greater Capacity.

If the supply of salmon on the Columbia river is as great during the season of 1904 as during the past few years, there will be a big increase in the pack. All of the lower river canneries are preparing to handle increased outputs, and the packing houses will doubtless be in shape to receive all the fish offered.

The Columbia River Packers' Association is making the greatest preparations for the season, and officials of that company said yesterday they expected to be able to handle all the fish offered by their fishermen. The North Shore plant of the association is now being fitted up, and when the season opens it will be in first class shape. The launch Comet yesterday took over a scow on which was loaded a large quantity of cannery machinery, including a boiler and retorts. This plant will be able to handle 35,000 cases of salmon during the coming season. It is located at Hungry harbor.

The association has also provided for increased output at its Rooster Rock and Eureka plants. Contracts have just been closed for double the working forces employed there last year, and, with the increased facilities, there is every probability that the offerings of the fishermen will be handled conveniently.

There will be one new packing house, at least, on the lower river this season. For some weeks Sofus Jensen, formerly with the Co-operative company and lately with the Portland-Alaska Packing Company, has been working on a new company to conduct a cannery at Altoona, Wash. Yesterday details of the incorporation were completed, all the stock having been subscribed, and the company will at once get matters in shape to run the plant this year. It is understood the new concern will depend for its supply of fish on the surplus from the other canneries.

Besides the improvements here noted, the handling capacity of the lower river plants will be materially increased by the enlargement of the Columbia River Packers' Association's cold-storage plant. The work of driving the foundation for the annex has been finished and lumber will be hauled to the scene at once for the new buildings.

James Quinn was down yesterday from Quinn's landing making arrangements to operate at the seining ground there, next season. The ground was cleared some years ago by J. O. Hanthorn, at considerable expense, but the effort to operate it proved unsuccessful and the venture cost something like \$20,000. This season Mr. Quinn will probably put in traps there and hopes to be able to make the ground pay.

Packers and fishermen alike are of the opinion that there will be no falling off in the supply of salmon this year as the hatcheries have all along been

doing good work. Indeed, indications are that the supply will be greater with each succeeding year, as the output of the hatcheries has steadily increased. With enlarged facilities this year, the amount of fish handled should exceed that of last season.
