## SCHOOL LEVY **NOTSO GREAT**

Eight-Mill Tax Decided Upon at a Meeting of Taxpavers Last Night.

#### REDUCTION IS THREE MILLS

Report of Clerk Ferguson Presented, Showing Reduction in Indebtduess of \$34,230.

A meeting of the taxpayers of school district No. 1 (the city of Astoria) was held at Shively school last night, when the levy for the year was fixed. The school board had carefully considered the matter and recommended to the taxpavers last night that the levy be \$ mills, on an assessed valuation of \$1,808,454. The recommendation of the board was adopted.

The levy fixed last night is 3 mills less than that of last year, when Il mills were assessed on a total valuation of approximately \$1,600,000. This year's levy will net \$14,467.53, whereas last year's tax brought in about \$17,-

### TO THE PUBLIC.

The attention of the public is called Repairs ..... 1,294 49 to the following rules and regulation of the state board of bealth:

> Rule 15-No person shall be admit!into any school or Sunday school trom any house or building in which has recently occurred a case of dangerous communicable disease, without first presenting a certificate, signed by a reputable physician, that all danger of municating such disease is past.

Rule 16-N parent, guardian, or other person having charge or control of any child or children shall allow or permit any child or children to go from any house or building in which a case of smallpox, diphtheria, membraneous croup, scarlet fever, measles, whooping cough, or other contagious disease has recently occurred antil such house or building has been properly disinfected, and quarantine has been removed by the health officer.

Rule 17-It shall be the duty of every physician called to attend a person sick, or suspected of being sick, or in the absence of a physician, every householder, wherein such sickness is found, too report within 24 hours thereafter, giving the name and residence of all cases of smallpox, diphtheria, membraneus group, scarlet fever, measles, or any other contagious disease, to the county health officer, or other health officer who has jurisdiction in the terri-

Hule 18-(in part)-It shall be the duty of the health officer, when a case of smallpox, yellow fever, diphtheria, membraneous croup, scarlet fever or measles is reported within its jurisdiction, to place, or cause to be placed, in a conspicious place a quarantine card upon which is printed in large letters the name of the disease or the word "contagious."

Section 10 of the state board of health laws is as follows:

"Any person who shall fail to obey conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$100, at the discretion of the court."

These rules will be very strictly enforced.

# DENOUNCED AND UPHELD

Nevada Senator Says President's Course Anent Panama Sounds Note of War.

### **PATRIOTICANNOUNCESDEPEW**

House Passes Legislative and Judicary Bill Appropriating \$30,000,000, Second Big One.

Washington, Jan. 14.-The senate today distened to speeches by Newlands on the Panama question, and Latimer. advocating the adoption of a plan for improvement of the public wagon roads of the country. Newlands declared that the course of the president in Panama, was an act of war and in contravention of the treaty of 1846 of international law, and of the constitution of the United States. Depew praised the president's policy as patriotic, justified by precedent and law. Consideration of the postoffice investigation resolution was postponed until next Mon.

Washington, Jan. 14 .-- The house today passed the legislative executive and judicial appropriation bill carrying an aggregate of nearly \$30,000,000, and adjourned until Monday. This is the second big supply measure to pass the

The house today refused to sustain the action of the committee as a whole which yesterday adopted an amendment striking out the paragraph providing for salaries and expenses of the civil service commission.
