RESOLUTIONS OF RESPECT

Chamber of Commerce Adopts Report to Memorialize Late Member.

C. R. THOMSON MAN OF WORTH

Senator Mitchell Writes That Fair Resolutions Will Be Brought to Attention of Senate.

At last night's session of the Chamber of Commerce, the report of the special committee, appointed at the last meeting to draw up memorial resolutions on the death of the late C. R. Thomson, was unanimously adopted. Following are the resolutions:

"Whereas, it has behoved an all wise Providence to take from the members of this organization C. R. Thomson, an esteemed member, and a citizen of worth, energy and affairs.
"Resolved, That the members of the Astoria Chamber of Commerce, realizing his worth as a man and as a respected citizen of Astoria, do thus express their regret for his death and loss.
"Resolved, That we express our deepest sympathy for his bereaved widow and children.
"Resolved, furthermore, That these resolutions be spread upon the minutes of the Chamber of Commerce, and a copy be sent to the family."

At last night's meeting of the Chamber of Commerce, Secretary Higgins read letters from Major Langfitt that were in reply to communications from the chamber regarding the proposed dredging and survey of the upper harbor. Mr. Langfitt writes that the only dredge that is available for the work is the Ladd and as soon as the vessel can be freed from her present duties will be operated at the point desired by the local commercial body. Also that the survey of the estuary near the tongue will be accomplished in the early spring, when the work can "be done without undue expense." The secretary was instructed to write Major Langfitt that as early a beginning as possible would be appreciated by the chamber.

A letter from the United States fish commission to Senator Fulton relative to the talked of hatchery at Warm Springs agency expressed the opinion that more data were necessary before anything active could be done in the matter. It appears that the importance of a hatchery at the agency is not clear to the commission, but that one on the Deschutes would evolve more genuine benefit. The information desired will be forwarded at an early date, until which time the proposition will be pending.

PIRATES CAPTURE WARSHIP SENT OUT TO CAPTURE THEM

San Francisco, Jan. 24.—News of an extraordinary act of piracy was brought here by Lieutenant Commander Anderson, of the United States navy, who arrived here Saturday from the Orient on the steamer Korea. A gunboat was captured shortly before the departure of the Korea from Shanghai by the pirates who infest the coast of China, and the authorities whose duty it is to fight the piratical bands have been paralyzed by the boldness of the deed.
Not only did the pirates succeed in capturing the tiny warship and making prisoners of all its crew, but they succeeded in running the vessel ashore and making their escape from the gunboat

ICE IS PILED THIRTY FEET

Gorge Formed in the Delaware River That Is Alarming in Proportions.

FAMILIES MOVE FROM BANKS

Bridges Are Weighted to Prevent Damage—No Such a Crush of Ice in Past Thirty Years.

Port Jervis, N. Y., Jan. 25.—An ice gorge has formed in the Delaware four miles below here and already is 30 feet high around an island in the middle of the river. The jam now reaches two miles above Port Jervis but the water which at first submerged a portion of the lower town, has fallen from 28 to 20 feet. It is running in a new channel over a farm on the Jersey shore, three miles below town. Families along the river are moving to higher ground.

At Tri-States, here the Neversink river joins the Delaware, the water in the Delaware is backing up into the Neversink and a new highway suspension bridge is threatened. The Erie bridges are being weighted to prevent damage. No such crush of ice has been seen hereabouts since 1875.

H. Mitchell acknowledged the adoption of the resolutions favorable to the Lewis and Clark fair at the recent session of the chamber. Mr. Mitchell will bring the action of the local body to the attention of the senate.

It was decided by motion that the regular initiation fee of \$5 be suspended for a period of one month in order that the roll of membership might be enlarged. This action was previously resorted to, and the result at that time was of such a nature that the chamber was encouraged to repeat the suspension.

The session closed with a brief speech by President Welch, in which he urged the members to turn out at the meetings of the body and to unite in every way possible for the upbuilding of the city. No changes have yet been made in the standing committees.
