Action of Caledonia Coal Company Involves Half a Miltion Dollars.

TRADE RESTRAINT CHARGED

Damages and Attorneys' Fees Will Be Fought For in the Courts-Alleges Rate Discrimination.

Denver, March 15 .-- A special to the News from Las Vegas, N. M., says:

One of the most important civil suits in the history of this territory, involving half a million dollars, has been filed in the United States court by the Caledonia Coal Company, of Gallup. The company sues the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Company, the Santa Fe Pacific Company, the Colorado Fuel & Iron Comapny and the American Fuel Company, for \$400,000 damages, \$50,000 attorneys' fees and costs, for alleged violation of the United States statutes to protect trade and commerce against the unlawful restraints and monopolies, and also the statutes regulating interstate commerce and trade. More specifically, the Santa Fe is charged with discriminating in its rates in favor of the Colorado Fuel & Iron Company.


